About the Board of Elections

The aim of the Livingston County Board of Elections is to serve the people of the county by ensuring that the elections and related activities are handled in an honest and open fashion according to the New York State Election Law, and that all people are given an opportunity to express their opinions through the electoral system.

The Board maintains the current voter registration file necessary to allow for participation in federal, state, county, and local elections. The Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners also assist in educating the citizens on the importance of exercising their civic duties through our democratic election process. The Board of Elections is made up of equal representation from the two major political parties, as required by the Election Law.

These notices explain how to make sure your vote counts and how to avoid over votes (filling in too many ovals) and double votes (voting more than once for the same candidate). Read the Notice concerning overvotes and double votes.



About the Board of Elections

The Board of Elections is responsible for the maintenance of over 54,000 voter registration files. The records are maintained on a computerized central file. In addition to applying by mail, qualified individuals can register to vote at the Board of Elections office in Little Valley, and at local polling places on local registration days. The Board processes approximately 4,000 new registration applications annually.

You should apply to register if you are not currently registered or have moved to a new address

The Board of Elections is directed by the New York State Election Law in the conduct of elections. The ballot is prepared and distributed by this Board. Persons who are unable to appear personally at the polls due to absence from the County, illness or permanent disability may apply for an absentee ballot. Every effort has been made to have polling places throughout Cattaraugus County handicap accessible. All ballots, paper and machine votes are re-canvassed by the Commissioners. The results are certified and the duly elected officials are notified.

Register to Vote

Voter Registration

To Register To Vote You Must:

- · Be a U.S. Citizen.
- Be 18 years old by December 31 of the year in which you register. * Note: You
 must be 18 years old by the date of the general, primary or other election
 in which you want to vote.
- . Be a resident of the county for at least 30 days before the election.
- · Not claim the right to vote elsewhere.
- · Not be in jail or on parole for a felony conviction.

Registration form (Spanish Version) (Complete the form and mail it to Livingston County Board of Elections. You may also register in person at our office.)

You need to re-register if:

- · You move out of the County.
- Change your name.
- · Change your party enrollment.
- · Move within the County.

Voting in Primary Elections

You must be enrolled in one of the 8 recognized parties (i.e., Democratic, Republican, Conservative, Green, Working Families, Independence, Women's Equality and Reform) and there must be a primary in the party in which you are enrolled.

Indicating your choice of party enrollment

Use the same form as you do to register to vote. In Section 1, indicate that you are filing either a new registration or a change of enrollment, then complete the rest of the form and choose your enrollment in Section 10. *Note: If you are already registered and are filing a change of enrollment, the change will not take effect until after the next November General Election.

Qualifications to Vote by Absentee Ballot

- · Absent from your county on Election Day.
- Unable to appear at the polls due to temporary or permanent illness or disability; or because you are the primary care giver of one or more individuals who are ill or physically disabled.
- · A patient or inmate in a Veterans' Administration Hospital.
- Detained in jail awaiting Grand Jury action or confined in prison after conviction for an offense other than a felony.

How to Vote by Absentee Ballot (Deadlines)

- Applications for Absentee Ballots are available at the Livingston County Board of Elections.
- You may also download a PDF version of the New York State Absentee Ballot Application Form. Absentee Application
- Upon completion, applications must be mailed to the Livingston County Board of Elections no later than the seventh day before the election or delivered in person no later than the day before the election.

If you cannot pick up your ballot, or will not be able to receive it through the mail, you have the right to designate someone to pick it up for you. Only that person designated on your application may pick up and deliver your ballot.

If you are permanently ill or disabled, you have the right to receive an Absentee Ballot for each subsequent election without further application. Simply file an application with the Livingston County Board of Elections indicating permanent illness or physical disability. You will then automatically receive an absentee ballot for every election until your registration is canceled.

Military and Overseas (Federal) Voting

Military Voting

Qualifications

 Persons serving in the military, along with their spouses and/or dependents, may register as a military voter in New York, entitling them to receive an absentee ballot for all federal, state and local races that they would be otherwise entitled to vote in if they were to go to their assigned polling place based on their New York residence.

Registering/ Applying for a Ballot

- To register as a new military voter and/or to request an absentee ballot, you must complete this application <u>Federal Post Card Application</u> and return application by mail to the Livingston County Board of Elections
- This application will register you (if not already registered) and will also serve as your absentee ballot application for 2 federal general election cycles.
- Always be sure to share any change of address information with the Livingston County Board of Elections.

Federal Voting

Qualifications

United States citizens living outside of the United States whose last U.S.
residence was in New York, along with their children, may register as a special
federal voter in New York, entitling them to receive an absentee ballot for all
federal races (President/Vice President, U.S. Senate and House of
Representatives) that they would be otherwise entitled to vote in based on your
New York address.

Registering/Applying for a Ballot

- To register as a new special federal voter and/or to request an absentee ballot, you
 must complete this application <u>Federal Post Card Application</u> and return
 application by mail to the Livingston County Board of Elections
- This application will register you (if not already registered) and will also serve as your absentee ballot application for 2 federal general election cycles
- Always be sure to share any change of address information with the Livingston County Board of Elections.


