

What Is FVAP?

The Federal Voting Assistance Program (FVAP) provides assistance to both *UOCAVA* citizens and election officials and is your primary resource for information on *UOCAVA*.

FVAP's purpose is to:

- 1. Assist uniformed services and overseas voters to exercise their right to vote and have an equal opportunity with the general population to have their vote counted.
- 2. Assist the States in complying with relevant federal laws, and advise them on ways to best comply.
- 3. Advocate on behalf of the Uniformed Services and overseas voters, identifying impediments to their ability to exercise their right to vote, and proposing methods to overcome those impediments.







What Is UOCAVA?

UOCAVA, or the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act of 1986, as amended by the MOVE Act, requires U.S. States and territories to allow certain U.S. citizens to apply to register and vote absentee in elections for federal office.

Citizens covered under UOCAVA include:

- 1. Members of the Uniformed Services or Merchant Marine who are absent from their voting jurisdiction due to their service.
- 2. Dependents of members of the Uniformed Services or Merchant Marine who are absent from their voting jurisdiction with the member.
- 3. U.S. citizens residing outside the United States and its territories.





UOCAVA at a Glance

The Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA) of 1986 covers **approximately 6 million** potential voters.

- ✓ More than 3 million U.S. citizens living, studying, and working overseas
- ✓ **1.4 million** absent members of the Uniformed Services and Merchant Marine
- 1.3 million dependents of members of the Uniformed Services and Merchant Marine





Challenges to UOCAVA Voting Success



1. Mobile Population: *UOCAVA* citizens tend to move frequently.




2. Complex Process: Variability in State voting procedures adds complexity.



3. Time Required: Delays in overseas mail reduce the time available to vote.



Election Officials:

Direct contact with voter, *UOCAVA* website, information, and training resources

Simplify Voting Experience

Federal Voting Assistance Program: Streamlines FPCA /FWAB forms, various resources provided, election official training

Tackling Challenge 2: Online Assistants

Benefits of the Online Assistants:

- 1. Generate only State-required fields.
- 2. Provide up-to-date information such as important State voting deadlines.
- 3. Provide an output package that allows voters to print, sign, and send their completed form or ballot.
- 4. Streamline voting process so no stage takes more than 15 minutes to complete.

Election Officials:

45-day ballot transmission, electronic options for registration and ballot request, expanded use of FWAB


Federal Voting Assistance Program: State support in adopting Initiatives, tollfree 1800# Fax/Email conversion, available call center, and partnerships with MPSA and USPS Voting Success Rate Same as General Population



Additional FVAP Resources: Electronic Transmission Service

To help election officials and voters avoid the costs associated with long-distance faxes, FVAP provides an Electronic Transmission Service (ETS) that allows *UOCAVA* balloting materials to be faxed **at no cost**.*



- Providing information on UOCAVA and other voting legislation.






